KEY DECISIONS

I **Handing over case to CBI**

- ▶ Cabinet has approved the transfer of investigation of suspected suicide case of Late Joshita Das, Assistant Engineer, PWD, Bongaigaon Sub-Division to Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI)

I **Extending ambit of Jiban Anuprerana Scheme**

- ▶ Cabinet has approved to expand the ambit of Chief Minister's Jibon Anuprerana Scheme to cover all full-time current research scholars including Divyang scholars enrolled in Central or State Government Institutions situated in Assam, admitted on or after 1st April 2021
- ▶ Almost 10,000 research scholars will benefit from this scheme

I **Support to SwaJal Mitras**

- ▶ To support families of SwaJal Mitras/Jal Sahayaks in the event of their demise, Cabinet has approved providing ex-gratia assistance of ₹5 lakh to the next of kin of the deceased

I **Relief for JJM contractors**

- ▶ Cabinet has approved interchange of Performance Guarantee obtained against the contracts for JJM schemes with balance bill amount due to the contracting agencies

I **24x7 Drinking Water in Badarpur**

- ▶ To provide piped drinking water to the people of Badarpur, Cabinet has approved the Badarpur Town Water Supply Scheme at a cost of ₹49.588cr

I Allotment of Land under Mission Basundhara 3.0

► Cabinet has approved

- Conversion of 299 proposals from Annual Patta to Periodic Patta in 8 districts
- Allotment of land for 10 infrastructure projects
- Reclassification of land for 118 proposals in Dibrugarh
- Transfer of land to 190 non-individual juridical entities in 7 districts
- Settlement of land to 1,742 indigenous landless families in Dhemaji

I Land settlement of indigenous communities

- Cabinet has approved the inclusion of Ahom, Koch Rajbongshi, Matak, Moran, Chutia, Gorkha, Tea garden and Adivasi communities in the list of protected classes of persons in the Tirap Tribal Belt, those who have been occupying the land prior to 2011 in the area

I LiDAR surveys for Guwahati and Sonai

► Cabinet has approved

- Aerial LiDAR survey and development of GIS Database for GMDA and GMC Area in Guwahati covering 328 sq. km which will help in assessment and maintenance of road, drains, pumping stations, transformers, etc.
- Aerial LiDAR Survey for the Sonai Irrigation Project in Cachar, Assam, covering 147 sq. km which will help in analysis of Catchment Area, planning of the Head Work, Canal Layouts and Command Area Mapping etc
